AccuRx - Our new online triage system

We have been trialling an online triage system for almost 1 year. We initially started with a 3-day trial of administration requests i.e. sick notes, test requests and referral queries. This went down well with patients as they were finding that they weren't having to wait in a phone queue, only to find out that the results weren't back yet, or messages being sent to the GP and waiting for a reply of an unknown time scale. After the 30 day trial we then opened up for medical requests i.e. clinical questions, medication queries.

We do allow a 72-hour turnaround to process any requests coming in.

More and more patients are starting to use this service to save time queueing on the telephone or to have a call back at an inconvenient time for them. The replies can be sent via text message if the patient prefers. This is not however, a "jump the queue" service for getting an appointment.

With the service becoming more popular, AccuRx is constantly developing. There are new features of "self-book" which allows you to book an appointment following a link without needing to be signed up to Patient Access or the NHS App.

HAY FEVER

Hay fever is a common allergic condition that affects up to 1 in 5 people at some point in their life. Symptoms can include sneezing; runny nose and itchy eyes. These happen when a person has an allergic reaction to pollen. People can be allergic to tree pollen (released during spring); grass pollen (released during the end of spring and beginning of summer); and weed pollen (released anytime from early spring to late autumn). There is currently no sure cure for hay fever, but most people are able to relieve their symptoms with treatment, at least tot a certain extent. Treatment options for hay fever include antihistamines, which can help to prevent an allergic reaction for

happening; and corticosteroids (steroids), which can help to reduce levels of inflammation and swelling. Many cases of hay fever can be controlled using over-the-counter medications from your local Pharmacy. However, if your symptoms are more troublesome, it's worth speaking to your GP as you may require prescription medication.
